For more than 100 years, Madison College, a world-class community college headquartered in Madison, Wis., has offered experiential learning opportunities to a diverse population of students with varying educational needs. Nearly 34,000 students come to classes at campuses in Madison, Fort Atkinson, Portage, Reedsburg and Watertown.
