



The Search for the Associate Vice President for Enrollment Management

The Vice President for Enrollment and Student Services, Dr. Melynda Huskey, invites nominations and applications for the position of Associate Vice President for Enrollment Management (AVPEM).

The Associate Vice President has the principal responsibility for crafting and implementing a comprehensive enrollment management plan for Western Washington University. The AVPEM establishes strategic and measurable enrollment goals in service to the University.

About the University. Established in 1893, Western is one of the top public, master's degree-granting universities in the nation. Western is the highest-ranking public, master's granting university in the Pacific Northwest and No. 2 in the West, according to the *U.S. News & World Report* college rankings. *Kiplinger's* ranks Western among the top 100 public colleges and universities in the nation that offer the best quality and affordability. *U.S. News & World Report* has named Western one of the most cost-efficient in the country among highly-ranked universities for several years in a row, and the *Chronicle of Higher Education* has recognized Western as a "Great Place to Work." Approximately 16,000 students are enrolled at WWU. Retention from freshman to sophomore year recently was 81% and the five-year graduation rate for the class that entered in 2012 was 64%.

Committed to both the academic and personal growth of students, Western faculty and staff empower students to be engaged and active agents of positive change in the world. In recent years, Western has received many accolades that highlight this dedication: Western is ranked first in the nation among medium-sized universities for Peace Corps participation; first in the nation among public, master's-granting institutions for the number of its graduates awarded Fulbright Fellowships; ninth, among all master's-granting institutions nationally, public or private, for the number of undergraduates who go on to earn doctorates; classified as a Carnegie Community Engagement University; and, designated a "Military Friendly School" by *G.I. Jobs* Magazine.

About the Division of Enrollment and Student Services. The associate vice president for enrollment management (AVPEM) reports to the vice president for enrollment and student services, along with the assistant vice president and director of financial aid, director of athletics, dean of students/associate vice president, division director of budget and administration, executive director for student success initiatives, director of university residences, director of LGBTQ+, and the executive director for health and wellness.

The mission of the Division of Enrollment and Student Services (ESS) is to engage prospective and current students in their pursuit of academic and personal excellence through outreach, support services, and co-curricular learning opportunities. Overall services in the Division support and shape the enrollment and persistence of students. ESS includes [18 program areas](#) with more than 300 permanent employees.

About the Position: The associate vice president for enrollment management (AVPEM) supports the mission of the Division of Enrollment and Student Services by providing leadership, expertise, analysis, and coordination in developing and implementing a comprehensive enrollment management plan for the university. The position establishes enrollment goals and well-planned strategies and tactics that shape the enrollment of the university in service to the university's vision and strategic plan. The position serves current and prospective students by integrating the work and services of 77 employees in the offices of Admissions, Registrar, New Student Services/Family Outreach, and Financial Aid, with an annual operating budget of approximately \$6M. The AVPEM works in close collaboration with colleagues across the campus and engages with current students, faculty, staff, administrators, and alumni in the recruitment, enrollment, and support of each incoming class as they transition to Western.
